Brief content of the academic discipline:

The structure of the classic module "Latin" has a systemic nature. The language is studied in 3 interrelated aspects. The first aspect is theoretical – knowledge of the structure of the Latin language at the phonetic, lexical, grammatical (morphological and syntactical) levels. The second aspect is historical-cultural and linguocultural – knowledge of the history and culture of the ancient world, symbolism, allusions and reminiscences of mythological nature. The third aspect – practical – is associated with the formation of skills: lexical and grammatical analysis of Latin texts; philological analysis of sources in Latin, translation (with a dictionary) of texts from Latin to Russian and from Russian to Latin.
