The history of antiquity and its place in the course of world history. The history of Ancient Greece: Minoan Crete and Achaean Greece; Ancient Greece in the Homeric (XI–IX centuries BC) and Archaic (VIII–VI centuries BC) periods; ancient Sparta; the history of Athenian slave-owning democracy; the Greco-Persian wars; the Peloponnesian War and the crisis of the polis system; the conquests of Alexander the Great and the history of the Hellenistic states. The history of Ancient Rome: the ancient history of Italy; the Etruscans; Rome in the royal period; The Roman Republic (late VI – late I centuries BC); the creation of the Roman Mediterranean state; civil wars and the fall of the Roman Republic; The Early Roman Empire; the crisis of the ancient slave-owning society in the III century AD; the early history of Christianity; The Late Roman Empire.
