Summary of the academic discipline:

The structure of the discipline "Social Psychology" has a systemic character and is represented by the following sections: "Introduction to Social Psychology", "Social Psychology of Personality", "Interpersonal Communication and Interpersonal Relations", "Group Psychology", "Social Behavior". The first section allows you to get acquainted with the subject, purpose, tasks and methods of social psychology, the main stages of its development as a science. The second section includes consideration of the problem of personality in the social world; connection of behavior with motivation and social attitudes of the individual. The third section is devoted to the consideration of various aspects of interpersonal communication and interpersonal relationships; familiarization with the concept of conflict, its structure, dynamics and strategies of individual behavior in a conflict situation. The fourth section examines the socio-psychological characteristics of a social group, group phenomena and processes, as well as patterns of behavior of an individual in a group. Significant attention is paid to the study of the psychological characteristics of human behavior in the crowd, to the consideration of the psychological mechanisms of the influence of a spontaneous group on an individual. The fifth section allows you to get acquainted with various types of human social behavior.
