Brief content of the academic discipline:

The structure of the academic discipline **«Social psychology»** has a systematic character and is represented by the following sections: «Introduction to social psychology», «Social psychology of personality», «Interpersonal communication and interpersonal relationships», «Group psychology», «Social behavior».

The first section allows to get acquainted with the subject, purpose, objectives and methods of social psychology, the main stages of its development as a science. The second section includes consideration of the problem of personality in the social world; the relationship of behavior with motivation and social attitudes of the individual. The third section is devoted to the consideration of various aspects of interpersonal communication and interpersonal relations; familiarization with the concept of conflict, its structure, dynamics and strategies of personal behavior in a conflict situation. The fourth section examines the socio-psychological features of a social group, group phenomena and processes, as well as the regularities of individual behavior in a group. Significant attention is paid to the study of the psychological characteristics of human behavior in a crowd, the consideration of the psychological mechanisms of the impact of a spontaneous group on an individual. The fifth section allows you to get acquainted with various types of human social behavior.
